Background Character Information:

Keep this information to yourself, and use it to help you to act in character throughout the mystery:

Scripted Dialogue Round 1

First Round

Questions you should ask:

John Macintosh is still recovering from a nasty accident on his bike a few months ago. Ask him if he has any further information about who might have done it.

You have heard that Serena Woolliams was at the centre of a disturbance in the town centre over the weekend. Talk to her and discuss what it was about.

Information you should reveal about yourself only when asked.

You have visited the solicitors several times lately. There has been a lot to sort out with the divorce proceedings, especially with regards to the bakery business.

Your credit card was rejected at a petrol station recently. The one you used was over its credit limit.

Scripted Dialogue Round 2

- Ken Doll** Well, I suppose we can take some comfort from the fact that at least Barbie didn't suffer.
- Martina Nuttyturnover** I guess you're right, although the way she was dragged about afterwards left her little in the way of dignity. Someone treated Barbie Doll as though she was some kind of child's toy.
- John Macintosh** It makes your blood boil, doesn't it? I can't pretend to have liked the woman, but I've never been so angry since I was dismissed from teaching because of my short temper.
- Pete Compass** Have you ever considered some sort of anger management course?
- Serena Woolliams** Well, if you're going to do a course then try to find one locally. There's no need to travel for such things, and travel is *so* bad for the environment...
- John Macintosh** I'd rather go by bike anyway. Presumably that suits you too, Serena! Still, the chance would be a fine thing.

Second Round

Questions you should ask:

Pete Compass mentioned that he has some new tubs for his vitamin pills. Has he found any uses for them outside work?

Venus Woolliams mentioned that Martina Nuttyturnover had been helping with her tennis, but there are rumours that they have also started to spend a lot of time in discussion, and at each other's houses. Ask Venus why that is.

Information you should reveal about yourself only when asked.

The ownership of the bakery business is a contentious issue. Your solicitor is arguing that you should be entitled to a share of that, whereas Barbie's has been taking the position that the marriage was so short that you should be entitled to none of it. Not only is she still living in the marital home, it seems likely that she will win the day on the bakery business too.

You have recently ordered a new BMW 3 series on lease hire. The lease period has just concluded on your X5, and you have decided on something smaller this time.

Do not read further until instructed by your host.

Scripted Dialogue Round 3

Martina Nuttyturnover

Well it's all pretty sneaky, isn't it? At least if you get stabbed or shot then you know about it.

Pete Compass

I imagine that you've caused a few deaths yourself in that sandwich shop of yours. I can only imagine what all those breakfast baps do to people.

Serena Woolliams

Aren't we supposed to be thinking about who committed the murder?

Martina Nuttyturnover

Well, I suppose we could call this brainstorming.

Ken Doll

I think that brainstorming is supposed to stick at least to the subject in hand. I'm not sure that breakfast baps entered into Barbie's death at all.

Serena Woolliams

She was a very beautiful and kind woman, but there was an underlying nasty streak there. Do you think that she could be deliberately hurtful, or just unthinking?

Pete Compass

Unthinking.. Most definitely.

Venus Woolliams Deliberate. Most definitely.

John Macintosh Well, either way, maybe that's what has put her where she is today...

Third Round

Questions you should ask:

There was a police car outside Martina Nuttyturnover's shop recently. Why were they visiting?

Ask Pete Compass why he split up from Venus Woolliams.

Information you should reveal about yourself only when asked.

You recently went to Barbie's house to discuss the divorce face to face, as you feel that the way things are going, you won't be getting your fair share of your collective property. It is possible that someone may have seen you parked there.

You cut your hand during the argument with Barbie about the divorce settlement. You were drinking coffee together in the kitchen when things got a little heated. You threw down your cup in frustration, and cut your hand clearing up the pieces. You applied a Band-Aid to it, removing it later when the bleeding stopped.

Concluding Statement

Use the following dialogue to summarise your position, speaking when indicated below.

Ken Doll speaks first, saying:

I suppose I must be one of the prime suspects here – divorce does the strangest things to people, and I did visit Barbie during the time in question.

It is a fact that Barbie and I didn't see eye to eye at the end of our marriage, and that maybe we should never have married. It is also true that I felt that she was not being reasonable with regards to the financial settlement between us, and that I was surprised and angry about that. I'm certainly not naïve enough to imagine that I will feature in her will, so her being dead won't help financial matters at all!

However, we just weren't made to be together – simple as that. I wouldn't have wanted her dead; there were too many smiles and good times to look back on for that.

After you have heard from all the guests make a prediction as to who the murderer is and why.
